Dear St. Paul's Friends,

The wonderful 1940's play, *I Remember Mama*, features a recurrent scene in which the entire family gathers around the kitchen table at the end of each week to learn how they have managed the household budget. The children pour out their earnings from various odd jobs. Father brings his paycheck and Mama adds up all the bills to see if there is enough to pay them. After much hemming and hawing, Mama finally announces, "Well, we don't have to go to the bank this week." Everyone lifts up a grateful cheer and goes on to enjoy a happy week-end. The children do not realize until much later in life that there really isn't any money in the bank, but they are nonetheless comforted by the thought that if they were ever to fall short of funds, Mama could always "go to the bank."

St. Paul's is truly blessed by the generosity of those former members of the parish who have provided endowment funds for the financial support of the church. "Yes, Mama," there is money in the bank, but no longer is there an endless supply of funds. During the small group meetings held early this past summer, the members of the Vestry shared their excitement with all the new ministry activity that is percolating at St. Paul's, but they also wanted to impart the urgency they felt to decrease the use of

endowment funds to supplement the operating budget of the church – particularly monies from the Robertson-Bernard Fund. The simple message was, "We need to cut our dependence on the Robertson-Bernard Fund by \$40,000." We have accomplished nearly \$24,000 of that hoped for decrease which is truly marvelous, but we still have a ways to go.

The Stewardship Meetings in the middle of October will give us all a chance to learn more about the challenges and opportunities that await us. We need to continue working towards lowering our expenses by turning lights off and managing our energy costs as efficiently as possible. We need to continue to invite friends and members of the community to join us in worship and in the many ministries of St. Paul's so that we can grow our way to financial independence from the endowment funds. Just like Mama's family, St. Paul's needs to strive towards "making ends meet" without having to go to the bank.

And, yet, it should never be forgotten that God is a generous giver. God has given us everything to do the work he has called us to do!

Historic Walking Tours and a Presentation on Petersburg African American History

The Petersburg Museums will proudly sponsor two Historic Walking Tours and a presentation on African American History in Historic Old Towne Petersburg in conjunction with the *Fall Family Festival 2009* on Saturday, October 17.

Two walking tours of Historic Old Towne Petersburg are scheduled; the first to begin at 11:00 am followed by the second at 3:00 pm. Tours will start at the Farmers Market in Old Towne and will be limited to 15 participants so please make your reservations early by phoning Catherine Taylor at the Siege Museum at 804-733-2402. The tours will last approximately 45 minutes to 1 hour. Bottled water will be provided.

The Petersburg African American History presentation will be held on the second floor at the Petersburg Area Art League located at 7 East Old Street from 12:00 noon until 1:00 pm. Although this event will not be limited, reservations must be made in order to reserve a seat - (804) 733-2402. Bottled water will be provided.

Reservations for the tours and the presentation must be made by October 14, 2009.

Petersburg Fall Family Festival

Petersburg traditionally celebrates the fall every year with the three-day festival, Nostalgiafest. This year the economy has limited the opportunity of such an extensive event; but, that presents a new opportunity, a one-day festival scheduled for Saturday, October 17th. Petersburg's Fall Family Festival—fun for the entire family with a fall, harvest theme. Beginning with the Farmers Market—a Saturday tradition which kicks-off at 7am —and continuing throughout the day, until 6:30, it will be a day packed with non-stop activities and excitement.

The Fall Family Festival will host a Kidz Zone with entertainment for children of all ages. In addition to traditional rides and games, there will be a petting zoo and stage performances by Bob & Judy, Puppeteers; Julian Pittman, Illusionist; and Signora Bella, Equilibrist. Music will fill the air throughout the day on the main stage with local talent represented by performances by Virginia State University, Petersburg High School and the Appomattox Regional Governor's School, Touch of Charm, in addition to Baby Huey & the Babysitters, The Top's Band, and The Indigenous Gourd Orchestra.

The Fall Family Festival all takes place in the heart of Old Towne Petersburg surrounding the Farmers Market building. Admittance is free and the event will be held rain or shine. Historic All Hallow's Eve Tours

The City of Petersburg's Museums' annual "Historic All Hallow's Eve Tours" will take place on Saturday, October 31st in Blandford Cemetery on Crater Road. The focus of the guided walking tours is the history of the cemetery and accounts of some of the permanent residents of Blandford Cemetery portrayed by costumed interpreters. Each tour features the stories of prominent businessmen, soldiers and civilians, as well as tales of an unrequited love and of a friendship with Edgar Allen Poe.

There is no vehicle parking allowed at the site. Event parking will be available at the gravel lot east of the Farmer's Market, next to the McIlwaine House (corner of Cockade Alley & Old Street). The tour begins when participants board the shuttle bus to the Reception Center at the cemetery. After participants' arrival and check-in, the tour guides will meet the groups and proceed to the cemetery for the sixty minute tour.

Participants are encouraged to bring a flashlight and wear walking shoes.

Tickets for the tour are \$7.00 per person for adults and \$5.00 for children under twelve. Reservations are required and can be made at the Blandford Church Reception Center, 111 Rochelle Lane. Space is limited. Reception Center hours of operation are Tuesday through Saturday, 10:00 to 5:00, and Sunday, 1:00 to 5:00.
